She devoted her life to serving seniors with dignity, compassion, and quiet strength. A woman of deep Christian Faith, she lived her life through humble service. Creative and free-spirited, she expressed herself through art, sewing, theater, and dance-earning awards and bringing color and joy wherever she went. She was unafraid to be herself, bold and beautifully unique. She attended and graduated from Weaver High School, also a graduate of Mount Mary University in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. While at Mount Mary University she courageously advocated for cultural representation, leading to the inclusion of black authors and African and Caribbean History in the Library. Many books by Black Authors on Black History were added due to her endeavors of enduring legacy of justice. She was a facilitator for a program called Alternative to Violence a workshop

for all those incarcerated.
